The ASCRS Foundation welcomed Barbara Erny, MD, to the team in 2018 as the ASCRS Foundation Medical Liaison for International Programs. This was a new volunteer position created to support the expanding scope of the Foundation's international work, which includes a diverse and growing network of nonprofit partners including Himalayan Cataract Project, Orbis, Seva Foundation, Vision Care, Global Sight Alliance, Moran Eye Institute, and DigSight.

Dr. Erny fosters collaboration and coordinates our efforts with partner organizations committed to eliminating curable cataract blindness in the developing world. Dr. Erny recently retired from private practice in Silicon Valley. A driving force behind her decision included the opportunity to fully devote her energies to advancing ophthalmology and cataract surgery in developing countries.

Dr. Erny earned her medical degree from Stanford University School of Medicine, where she also completed her ophthalmology residency. Before her transition into the Medical Liaison role, Dr. Erny spent 26 years as the leading cataract surgeon at the Palo Alto Foundation Medical Group. She has been on our ASCRS Foundation International Committee for several years and is uniquely suited to this new role given her long-term commitment to charitable eye care.

For the past 25 years Barbara has volunteered with Himalayan Cataract Project, SEE International, The Flying Doctors, International Aid, Amazon Promise, and others teaching and providing humanitarian service in South and Central America, Africa, and Asia. She has twice made extended visits to Ethiopia where she has taught and mentored local ophthalmologists at the ASCRS Foundation Sinskey Eye Institute.

Dr. Erny's work will focus on helping the Foundation and our partners address the root cause of global cataract blindness – the shortage of eye surgeons. Together, we are committed to long term solutions that build local surgeon capacity in developing countries.

Endowed by a generous gift from David and Victoria Chang, the ASCRS Foundation Chang Humanitarian Award honors outstanding humanitarian work with a focus on cataract blindness and disability. Richard Litwin, MD, embodies this purpose through extensive humanitarian work that has become a family affair.

Dr. Litwin began with a high-volume cataract surgery mission trip in 1982 to a then littleknown facility in south India, Aravind Eye Hospital. The trip would be the beginning of a now 4-decade length of service.

"Witnessing my first eye camp in Pondicherry, India, in a few days I saw a thousand patients cured of cataract," he said. "I saw the good that an ophthalmologist can do in an area devoid of doctors. I was hooked."

On this same trip, he demonstrated how IOL implantation to Aravind's founder, Dr. Govindappa Venkataswamy, at a busy eye camp. When Dr. Venkataswamy noted the patient—a carpenter—could return to gainful employment postop, Dr. Litwin committed himself to making an IOL available to every patient.

With Dr. Litwin's advocacy, and support from Seva Foundation, Aravind began manufacturing IOLs at its own facility, Aurolab, in 1992. Later, he focused on instructing local doctors on how to perform these vital procedures themselves. Dr. Litwin worked with the World Health Organization to launch what has become perhaps the most effective ophthalmic training program in the world, the Aravind Eye Care System.

At this time in his storied career, he has shifted his focus to diplomacy, advocating internationally on behalf of humanitarian eye care organizations. Dr. Litwin has earmarked the \$50,000 grant to support Seva Foundation.

"Dr. Litwin is a great role model for ophthalmologists from developing countries. He cultivates long-term friendships and mentorships." said Dr. Chundak Tenzing, medical director of Seva.

"Dick personifies the unsung hero -

someone who neither seeks, nor receives recognition for a lifetime of great deeds, added Dr. Chang. "Indeed, very few will have heard of this ophthalmologist in solo private practice, who's had tremendous impact on the treatment of cataract blindness in the developing world."

"I can never repay you.

Thank you so much. I'm enjoying eyesight like I haven't had since I was about nine-years-old. I'm so excited with this new lease on life. I can drive myself and handicapped parishioners to church again," Leslie, an Operation Sight patient.

Operation Sight was launched by the ASCRS Foundation four years ago to meet the needs of American patients like Leslie. Through Operation Sight, the ASCRS Foundation has created a national network of volunteer ASCRS-member surgeons who give their time and expertise to treat needy cataract patients who have no other option. The program has seen an exponential growth in volume, with more than 3,000 free cataract surgeries provided to date.

This growth was reflected in the celebration of our 3rd Annual National Sight Week (October 14-20), when our surgeons, staff, and volunteers outdid themselves and treated 310 patients!

While the Operation Sight program runs year-round, the ASCRS Foundation began the National Sight Week initiative to increase overall understanding of patient need and encourage surgeons to the join the growing volunteer network.

The ASCRS Foundation provides the administrative support needed to identify and pre-qualify patients and then matches them with local volunteer surgeons.



In 2005, a back injury on a construction site prompted James Ross to switch jobs and start driving trucks. A few years later, medication prescribed for the back injury presented a side effect that would stall his truck driving career – cataracts. At age 51, James was desperately in need of cataract surgery, but could not afford the cost of surgery. After a quick google search James learned about the Operation Sight program. James was matched with volunteer surgeon Jeffrey Whitman, MD, from Key-Whitman Eye Center in Dallas, Texas.

"Everyone I've seen through this program wants to work or get back to work. Like a truck driver who loses his license because he can't see well enough to drive or a teacher who can't see to do what she needs to in the classroom, we've seen all of that. There are many ways you can get people back on their feet, but these folks just want to get back to a normal useful participation in the workforce. They simply need the vision for it," explains Dr. Whitman.

For James, the road to regaining his vision after cataracts was a long journey. "In 2010, I got one of the cataracts removed. After that, my wife and I were dealing with some financial and family issues, so I've been trying to get the second cataract removed for some time," James says.

His cataract was so bad that James had a driving restriction on his license. He also had to give up the activities he once enjoyed doing like playing basketball and baseball.

After cataract surgery with Dr. Whitman, Ross's vision has improved drastically. At his post-operative exam following cataract surgery at Key-Whitman, Ross's visual acuity was 20/30 without correction. Even better, he has a letter from Dr. Whitman stating that his vision has been corrected, so he can go to the DMV and get the restriction removed from his driver's license.

"The best thing about having cataract surgery for me was regaining control of my life. I can drive again. I can work again. It's just awesome, and I'm so thankful," Ross says.

\$250 per month. That is the salary of an ophthalmology resident in Ethiopia. You might think that works because of a lower cost of living. But in the cities, it is not much lower than in the U.S.

Ethiopia has five ophthalmology residency programs. Some of these four-year training programs have most sub-specialties covered, but there is no neuro-ophthalmologist in the entire country of 105 million people and only a handful of retinal specialists. Ethiopia has approximately one practicing ophthalmologist per million people, and about 1 million people completely blind from cataracts.

To become an ophthalmologist is Ethiopia is a long road. After high school, a student goes to college/medical school for 6 years. The last year is spent at that university hospital doing an internship. After that, the student is assigned to "serve" as a low paid primary care doctor somewhere in the region. During that time, they can apply for any specialty, or decide to stay a GP. It is very attractive to become a general surgeon or internist I was told, because graduates can match right away, and "they will be rich."

Ophthalmology is not well supported or well-paid compared to other fields, as eye care is not a government priority. The young doctors wait a long time to match in an ophthalmology residency, having to serve between 2-6 years as a GP. To train sub-specialists and support residency programs, the ASCRS Foundation relies on your kind donations. Because of you, the quality of ophthalmologist training is rapidly improving, and the number of residents is increasing each year. Only with enough funds to help pay for residency directors, the doctors teaching at Sinskey Eye Institute, and fellowship training, can we help tackle the cataract blindness and countless other eye conditions in Ethiopia.
